### **Biography**

The Belgian singer Eva Buchmann was born in 1982 in Hulst, Holland. She studied music at the Jazz-Institute-Berlin and the Royal Conservatory of Antwerp where she got her master's degree in jazz singing in 2008. During her studies Eva had the chance to sing with the European Yamaha Big Band led by Peter Herbolzheimer and Pierre van Dormaels' Connected To Hope. In 2009 Eva Buchmann's duo "Lottchen" was awarded by the "Kultur Kuratorium Aargau", with a grant that enabled them to make their first album "Lazy Afternoon". In 2010 she won the first prize of The International Jazz Competition For Singing Musicians "Voicingers" in Poland. Eva completed an intensive study of Complete Vocal Technique at the Complete Vocal Institute in Copenhagen. Pursuing a life of jazz singing Eva moved to the musically flourishing city of Cologne in Germany.

Eva Buchmann doesn't necessarily need words to tell stories. With mere sounds and her self brewed vocabulary, she invites the listener to wander with her. Like taking an instant holiday. When she uses words, all kind of poetry is recycled and given new meaning. Her compositions are as close to modern jazz, as to singer-songwriting, world music or to what she calls, organic pop music. Genres happily collide in Eva's repertoire, elegantly woven together with her subtle way of scatting and her unmistakable warm sound color. The band is nothing but a catalyst for her music.
